
SUBJECT: HOURS OF SALE FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION
BY A HOTEL OFF-PREMISES PERMITTEE

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Law empowers the State Liquor Authority to grant to hotel licensees, under specified circumstances, the right to sell liquor and wine for off-premises consumption under the same terms and conditions as apply to off-premises licensees.

To assure understanding among hotel licensees who hold permits for the sale of liquor and wine for off-premises consumption, as to their obligations under the law, the State Liquor Authority notifies such licensees that the hours applicable to retail licensees for off-premises consumption are also applicable to such HOP Permittees with regard to the sale of liquor and wine for off-premises consumption.

HOP Permittees may not be open for business in the section of the hotel devoted to the off-premises sale of liquor and wine, nor may they sell such alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption during the hours when retail off-premises licensees are prohibited from doing so.
