

Job Impact Statement

The proposed new subdivision (m) of section 106.3 of Title 9, Subtitle B, of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations (N.Y.C.R.R.) would update the Authority's ATAP minimum curriculum requirements to ensure information regarding human trafficking detection and prevention are required as part of all ATAP training courses. This regulatory proposal would thus help the Authority promote the health, welfare and safety of the people of New York by ensuring retail liquor licensees and their staff members have access to this lifesaving information and training. The amendment would not impose any new or additional compliance requirements and no new professional services would be required to comply with the proposed rule amendments as this proposal merely seeks to add information regarding human trafficking detection and prevention to the Authority's minimum ATAP curriculum requirements. As a result, the proposed amendment will not have any adverse impact on jobs or employment opportunities. Because it is evident from the nature of the proposed amendment that it will have no impact on jobs or employment opportunities, no further steps were needed to ascertain those facts and none were taken by the Authority. Accordingly, a full Job Impact Statement is not required for the proposed amendment and none has been prepared.
