

Rural Area Flexibility Analysis

The proposed new subdivision (m) of section 106.3 of Title 9, Subtitle B, of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations (N.Y.C.R.R.) would update the Authority's ATAP minimum curriculum requirements to ensure information regarding human trafficking detection and prevention are required as part of all ATAP training courses. This regulatory proposal would thus help the Authority promote the health, welfare and safety of the people of New York by ensuring retail liquor licensees and their staff members have access to this lifesaving information and training. The amendment, by its very nature, would not impose any adverse impact on facilities in rural areas, and would not impose reporting, record keeping or other compliance requirements on facilities in rural areas. Because it is evident from the nature of the proposed amendment that it will have no adverse impact on rural areas, no further steps were needed to ascertain those facts and none were taken by the Authority. Accordingly, a full Rural Area Flexibility Analysis is not required for the proposed amendment and none has been prepared.
