

*Regulatory Flexibility Analysis for Small Businesses and Local Governments*

The proposed new subdivision (m) of section 106.3 of Title 9, Subtitle B, of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations (N.Y.C.R.R.) would update the Authority's ATAP minimum curriculum requirements to ensure education regarding human trafficking awareness detection and prevention is a required part of all ATAP training courses. This regulatory proposal would thus help the Authority promote the health, welfare and safety of the people of New York by ensuring that retail liquor licensees and their employees have access to this life saving information and training. The amendment, by its very nature, would not impose any adverse economic impact on small businesses or local governments. Participation in ATAP is voluntary. The amendment would not impose reporting, record keeping or other compliance requirements on small businesses or local governments. It is evident from the nature of the proposed amendment that it will have no adverse impact on small businesses or local governments; the Authority thus had no need to take further steps to ascertain those facts. Accordingly, a full Regulatory Flexibility Analysis for Small Businesses and Local Governments is not required for the proposed amendment and none has been prepared.
